You have received this letter from Emera New Brunswick because you live or work within the Brunswick Pipeline's Emergency Planning Zone, an area extending 800 metres on each side of the Brunswick Pipeline. Emera New Brunswick, owner and operator of the Brunswick Pipeline, focuses its emergency planning and pipeline safety activities in this area.
